It was my dream to tell teens about Fetal Alcohol and why mothers should not drink while they are pregnant or breastfeeding. Most people don't know about FASD. I do.

You see my bio-mom drank while I was in her stomach. I have permanent brain injuries because of it, but it doesn't stop me from being the best I can be. I represent teens who are adopted, in foster care and/or have a disability. I want to spread the word that everyone can make a difference no matter where you come from and what disability or kind of family you have. Every person is important. I am a mixture of many nationalities. No matter what color you are or what you look like I think everyone should be treated equally.
